

Point Give a viewpoint of agree OR disagree. This could be your point of view or the views of another person.

Explain and evidence Say WHY you/they think this. What evidence do they have? If we have a point of view we should have some evidence to back it up.

Example There is no evidence for God

Point Some people believe that there is no evidence for a god to exist, these people are called atheists. Atheists believe there is not, and never could be, a god - that humans are responsible for our actions and the world has come about by accident, not design.

people don't usually 'see' a god. Most people require evidence that they can experience in order to believe things, for example they want to see or hear something for themselves. It is very easy to deny that someone has had an experience when we haven't also had it.

Argue Someone might disagree with this as they might be theist; this means that they believe that God/a god does exist. They might say that there is plenty of evidence such as holy books or people's personal experiences. For example, Nicky Cruz has spoken about his conversion experience. They might feel that it is rude to doubt whether someone is telling the truth.

Link I believe there is evidence for God such as holy books and experiences. However, there is no 100% proof and that is why many people are agnostic.

Statements to respond to:

- God is impossible
- The world is so perfect it must have been designed
- Everyone should believe the same things
- Faith is important
- We should demand evidence for everything
- In the future more people will be atheist than agnostic or theist
- Agnostics need to make up their minds
- We will never prove God either way so there is no point trying
