Each topic will require you to study the classical sociological theories and apply them to the contemporary world around you. There is never 'one-way' of looking at things in sociology, it is all about taking different perspectives into account, which will also build your analytical skills (which are highly valued by universities and employers!)

Overview of the course:

This is a two-year course. There are 3 A Level papers that are sat at the end of year 13, each 2-hous long. Overall grades are recorded on a scale A*-E.

Expectations of the course:

- Lessons consist of taking notes, group discussions, group work and PowerPoint presentations. Please bring a folder to your first lesson you'll eventually need one for each topic. Folder checks will take place regularly throughout the year.
- Homework consists of activities, note making, wider reading, research, past exam questions, power points and essays. It is expected that about 5 hours a week will be spent on sociology homework.
- Your progress will be reviewed on a regular basis. The review process will provide feedback at specific times throughout the year.
- You are expected to use the resources available to you in the library and are strongly encouraged to use libraries outside of school, not just the internet.
- USE YOUR STUDY TIME AND BE PRO-ACTIVE. This is a content-heavy course and you MUST be revising content CONTINUOUSLY.
